The annual Nall Hills Homes Association meeting was held November 17, 2005 at Indian Woods Middle School, with 86 attendees and 54 proxies. Members enjoyed sandwiches and cookies from Price Chopper during the social time before the meeting.

Mark Sutton, President, made opening remarks highlighting 2005 events. Cindy Fisher, Secretary, read highlights of the minutes from the 2004 annual meeting, which were then approved. Copies of the entire report were available.

Marcia Gilliland, City Councilwoman, was the guest speaker. Board members Mark Able, Linda Kana, and Bob Johnson gave reports regarding the budget, the Share-a-Repair service, our growing baseball program and our website. Mark Able presented the 2005 financial statement and the proposed budget for 2006-2007, recommending that we raise 2006 dues to \$122. A motion was

made and passed to this effect. The slate for the 2006 Board of Directors was presented and approved.

President Sutton led a discussion of the replacement of our Nall Hills neighborhood markers, a project headed up by Dennis Wagner, Vice-President.

Lastly, door prizes contributed by area merchants were awarded, ending with the grand prize, 2006 Nall Hills dues paid in full.

Nall Hills Markers

If you've taken a close look at our Nall Hills markers recently, you've probably noticed that they are in need of repair. Paint is fading and flaking, and cement is crumbling.

The Board has discussed this issue for a couple of years. At this point, it seems to be most prudent to invest in new markers. It also happens to coincide with our 50-year anniversary of Nall Hills, so it seems fitting to update and freshen up our neighborhood with new markers.

A good discussion took place at the annual meeting, including ideas for the styling of the markers, as well as a possible contractor.

Be assured that, as your elected Board, we will take care in selecting good quality, yet affordable, markers.

We want lowmaintenance, longlasting markers. At the same time, we do not want to incur an additional assessment to pay for them.

The number of new markers will be dependent on cost. This will most likely mean that we will remove all of the 29 current markers and replace them with fewer new markers.

Trash Pick-Up

The Nall Hills Homes Association yearly dues are spent very wisely by the Board of Directors. Our trash collection fees are significantly smaller than our closest neighbors and we get trash pick-up twice each week.

Trash pick-up continues with Deffenbaugh Disposal. Please remember that the Monday or Tuesday pickup must be at the curb. The Thursday or Friday pick-up may be at the houseline or at the curb; however, yard trash and abnormal items must always be at the curb with a maximum of 10 bags per pickup. This insures that everyone will get their trash picked up that day. Please cut tree branches into lengths of four feet, tied in bundles of no more than 18 inches in

New to Trailwood: FULL DAY KINDERGARTEN

The Board of Education approved Trailwood as one of ten schools to pilot an optional, full-day kindergarten next yearat a cost of \$60.00 per week. Students participating in the Federal Free or Reduced Cost Lunch program may attend at no cost to the parents. The current half-day kindergarten format will continue to be offered at no cost, but the current JCPRD kindergarten enrichment program will not. The JCPRD before and after school program will continue as an option for all students at Trailwood.

BOOK FAIR

Our Scholastic Book Fair raised \$2,100 for our library to purchase books and tests for our Accelerated Reader Program.

COMMUNITY SERVICE The Trailwood STAR

community service program (Students at Trailwood Are Responding) has had four major projects this year. Funds and materials totaling \$2,300 were collected for hurricane relief efforts. A canned food drive brought in over 1000 cans, and over 3000 books were gathered for Swope Health Services, a local organization that provides health care to Kansas City area children. Funds were raised to provide food for orphans in South Africa and plans are underway for our students to link up with these children as pen pals, trading friendship bracelets, and sending books and other learning tools to their schools. Current projections put the number of South African orphans at 5.5 million within 5 years.

PTA Activities

Trailwood's PTA is strong with over 96% of families participating. With the PTA's support, Smart Boards, Einstruction systems, LCD projectors and wireless kevboards were added to support existing technology so teachers can explore use of these new tools in their classrooms.
