The annual Nall Hills Homes Association meeting was held November 14, 2006 at Indian Woods Middle School, with 99 attendees and 49 proxies. Members enjoyed sandwiches and cookies from Hy-Vee during the social time before the meeting.

Mark Sutton, President, made opening remarks highlighting 2006 events. Linda Kana read highlights of the minutes from the 2005 annual meeting, which were then approved. Copies of the entire report were available.

Unit Commissioner Vic Miles presented the Boy Scout Pack #3286 Charter to the Nall Hills Homes Association and thanked the organization for sponsoring the troop for 30 years.

Board members Mark Able, Linda Kana, Dennis Wagner and Bob Johnson gave reports regarding the budget, the Share-a-Repair service, the Nall Hills Marker Replacement, our growing baseball program, and our website. Mark Able presented the 2006 financial statement and the proposed budget for 20072008, recommending that we lower the 2007 dues to \$103. A motion was made and passed to this effect. The slate for the 2007 Board of Directors was presented and approved.

President Sutton led a discussion of the change in our trash pick up schedule.

Lastly, door prizes contributed by area merchants were awarded, ending with the grand prize, 2007 Nall Hills dues paid in full.

Trash Pick-Up

The Nall Hills trash contract with Deffenbaugh changed effective January 1, 2007 to one pick-up per week. Even with this change, our trash collection fees are still significantly lower than our closest neighbors and this has been reflected in the reduced annual dues for 2007.

The weekly pick-up is either Monday or Tuesday, same as in 2006. The Thursday / Friday pickup has been discontinued altogether. Homeowners should have there trash out by 7am on their designated day, but no earlier than 24 hours prior to the pickup. Tree branches should be cut in to lengths of four feet, tied in bundles of no more than 18 inches in diameter. All other abnormal household items, appliances and

some construction materials will require a special pickup (there is a fee for this). For special pick-us, call Deffenbaugh at 631-3300.

Neighborhood Tips

Pride in our neighborhood keeps property values up and peace among neighbors.

Sometimes, because of health issues, job loss, busy lives, or not knowing what is expected, we may fall out of compliance with city regulations.

Nall Hills residents may leave a message on the Nall Hills phone line, noting the <u>house number</u> and street where there is a problem.

The Homes Association sends courtesy letters to homeowners as appropriate.

Common issues:

- Peeling paint (over 10% of any surface)
- Exterior storage of items: <u>Please</u> <u>store trash</u> <u>containers out of</u> <u>sight per city</u> <u>ordinance.</u>
- Inoperable vehicles in the driveway
- Storage of recreational vehicles (One RV, boat, or camper may be stored on the side or rear yard on grass or pavement. It may be parked in the front driveway twice in a 30-day

time frame.)

 Leaves or debris in curb or street

An alternative would be to call the Overland Park Neighborhood Preservation Office, now called Community Services (913-895-6370) or email property@opkansas.org to leave a message for a city inspector.

Free brochures on a number of home maintenance topics are available at the Community Services office in the OP Community Center, 6300 W. 87th Street (the NW corner of Lamar and 87th Street).



Nall Hills Marker Update

Over the last few years the Board spent a considerable amount of time discussing ideas from residents and contractors to create a new marker for Nall Hills.

If you've taken a close look at the markers recently you will have noticed that several of the markers need considerable repair. Paint is fading and flaking and the cement is crumbling as well.

At the annual meeting

this year the Board presented a drawing of the proposed new Nall Hills marker. A discussion was held on the quality, lowmaintenance and durability of the marker. It was also noted that no additional assessments would be made to the residents of Nall Hills. A vote was taken at the meeting to move forward on the replacement of the markers.

Nall Hills currently has

28 markers and we plan on replacing approximately 20 markers. This will allow us to keep future maintenance osts down and maintain the quality of the markers.

The replacement of the markers is expected to be completed by this summer.

We would also like to thank Matthew Connolly (a NHHA resident) of MDC Architecture, Inc. for his help and design of the marker.
